This dates back 10,000 years to when the first humans kept goats as farm livestock in the Middle-East.

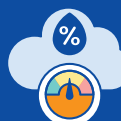
Did you know

Most goats don't like rain



A mature goat feels most comfortable
at temperatures of 10-20°C



They prefer 60-70% humidity

In the Netherlands, most farmers choose to keep their goats inside all year. Indoors, the climate can be regulated to the exact needs of the goats and their preferred conditions. When goats are inside it's easy to check their health & well-being.



Dutch White Saanen Goat



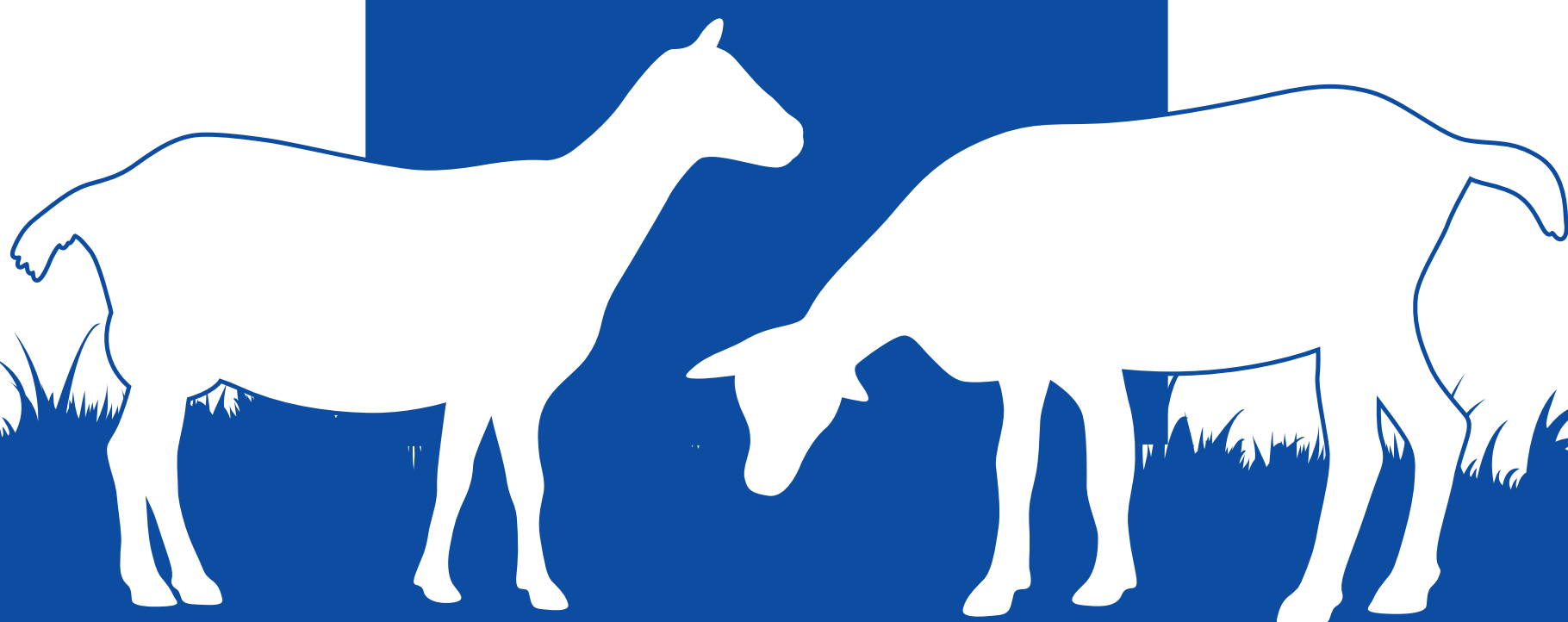
In the Netherlands, 90% of the goats at dairy farms are white-coloured Saanen breed goats. This breed is known for its high quality milk.



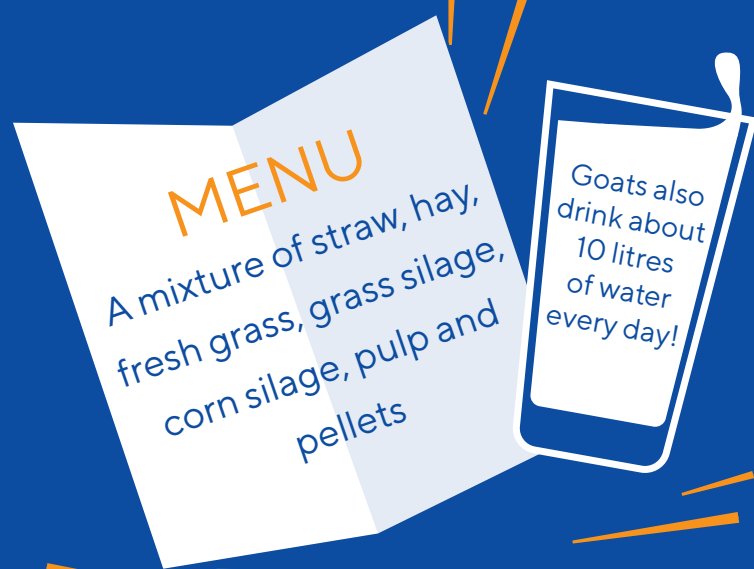
In the Netherlands, there are over 300 professional goat farms.

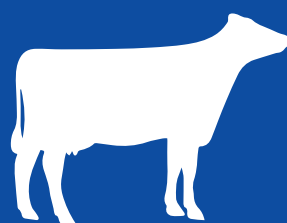
